The Bloomfield City Council met in regular session at 7:00pm at the Bloomfield Public Library with the following members present:

Mayor Miller called the meeting to order and welcomed those present.
Everyone stood and recited the pledge of allegiance.

Motion by Bohi, second by Husted to approve the agenda.

Mayor Miller announced this is the time and place fixed for a Public Hearing for the purpose of approving an ordinance amending Chapter 122 of the City code of the City of Bloomfield by modifying exemptions to the license requirement for Transient Merchants.

Motion by Walton, second by Bohi to open the Public Hearing.

The Mayor called for any public comments. No oral objections or comments were offered and the Clerk reported that no written objections or comments thereto had been filed. Mayor Miller did go on record saying that he felt the City should charge a fee for all vendors.

UPDATES

Police

- The training for the safe schools is going well.
- Homecoming is next week. Kids will be directed to go home at 10 pm. when quiet hours begin. TPing will only be allowed if the homeowner agrees. Any situations that arise will be handled individually.
- Some of the Council received an email regarding the south parking lot at the high school. There have been students on mopeds that have been riding their mopeds and being loud. Zach will meet with Dan Maeder and Danny Roberts to figure out a solution.

Main Street

- Another good turnout at the Farmer's Market this week.

Motion by Howard, second by Bohi to authorize Mayor to sign Scope of Engagement with Ahlers Cooney, P.C. for Fowler Development Agreement.

Interim Police Chief Zach Dunlavy reported on the need for an additional police officer.

Currently the department is patrolling and doing investigations at the same time with only one officer on duty. There have been 900 more contacts this year than last year so far. If the school does go ahead with a resource officer, this additional officer would work between the school and the department. City Administrator Day reported that the City is currently paying out about \$12,000 in overtime to the officers just so they can have all of the 24/7 shifts covered. An additional officer salary is in the budget.

Motion by Howard, second by Bohi to have Dunlavy and Howard, the Police Liaison, start the process of finding an additional police officer.

Representatives from the Pay As You Save (PAYS) program gave a presentation about the energy efficiency program and answered questions the Council had. The program is set up to help improve energy efficiency in homes. PAYS will send the presentation to the Council so that they can have more time to read it over and decide whether or not to proceed.
