





Development and Promotion Committee Report 2022

The 2022 budget projected the Development and Promotion Committee would receive \$1,400 from memberships/donations, and \$1395 was received. All other expenditures for marketing, memberships, the web-site and other expenditures were paid for by the committee from carry-over funds built up over the years from memberships and projects not completed. The 2022 expenditures reduced these funds by approximately \$6750.00.

The committee applied for and was awarded \$4,000.00 in Hotel-Motel Tax funds. Phyllis and Judy provided off-set receipts to the city in December and the reimbursement check was received after Jan 1, 2023. These funds will be utilized in 2023.

*Reimbursed \$305.00 to Bloomfield Democrat for Bloomfield Bucks utilized by winners of Our lowa ads. The ads for bringing visitors to Davis County are accomplishing the goal.

Website:

Purchased a lap-top computer and software from DP Solutions in the amount of \$1,216. Paid domain fee, domain hosting fee, and weekly listing of website in the Bloomfield Democrat. A huge "thank you" to Joye Lore-Lawson for the many hours she has devoted to rebuilding the web-site and greatly expanding social media.

Group Bus Tours: There were four tours in 2022

June 15: AARP group from Ottumwa; all day tour with noon meal at Drakesville Methodist Church; 34 travelers; coordinated by Judy; Joye joined the group for entire tour and Joe Dotterer stopped in for visit at Wyacondah Stables; a.m. at Historical Complex

August 5: Elite Tours from Omaha, NE; half day tour with meal at Methodist Church in Drakesville; 32 travelers; coordinated by Joye; new Amish stop: Mast Buggy Shop

August 17: Neihart Tours from Braddyville, IA; 45 travelers with noon meal at Methodist Church in Bloomfield; assisted by Judy but no tour guide; stops at Wyacondah Stables and Dutch Country

October 4: Davis County Retired School Personnel; 19 local travelers with meal at The Red Shed; Don and Judy Combs served as guides; stops at T-Corner Woodworking, Wanna Ride Buggy Shop and Amish school

New Projects: Executive committee action determined volunteer resources were not available this year to participate in the CITR Group Tour Marketplace. Funds budgeted for Marketplace were re-directed to participate in Discover the Shops of Davis County (\$235.) and to partially fund a visit by the Iowa Gallivant, Jay Goodvin, (\$375) on December 12-14. Joye coordinated the Gallivant visit that involved several businesses and time for him to explore on his own.

Other Expenditures:

*Membership in Central Iowa Tourism Region	\$400	.00

*Lodging & Mileage for Joye to attend the iowa Tourism Conference \$237.80

*Registration and mileage for five board members to attend CITR May meeting \$139.20 and training in Pella. Topic was "Influencers", a new buzz-word in tourism. It will be interesting to evaluate how the influencer we hired in the form of "the Gallivant" will impact tourism efforts in Davis County. This is seldom easy to accomplish.

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Latest Project: Updating and Reprinting The Bloomfield and Davis County maps brochure: Judy and Joye worked to update this brochure. Rich Fetcho added the bike/walking trail. It was updated by Bloomfield Communications where the brochure was still on file. 4,500 are being printed at a cost of \$336.00 plus design work cost. The expenditure will be included in the 2023 budget.

New Materials in 2022 for creating awareness:

*Large 3 x 4 posters in color of the courthouse bell and clock have been created by Ron Bride; stored at the recorder's office; were utilized by Judy when she and Ron Johnson gave a presentation on "Tourism in Davis County" to the District meeting of Retired School Personnel in May; will be a great asset when groups visit the court house for a presentation or when we share local history with student groups.

*Mormon Trail Coloring Books are a great way to create awareness and interest in history of the area; shared with students of two Amish schools as a thank you for visits


*At long last the interpretative signs created through a Historic Hills Byway project are installed

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
Iowa Travel Guide


